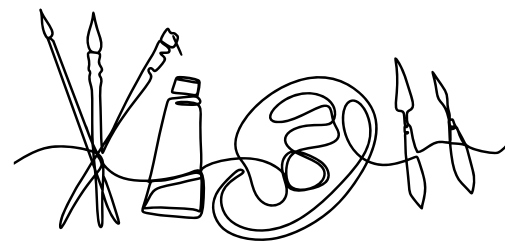

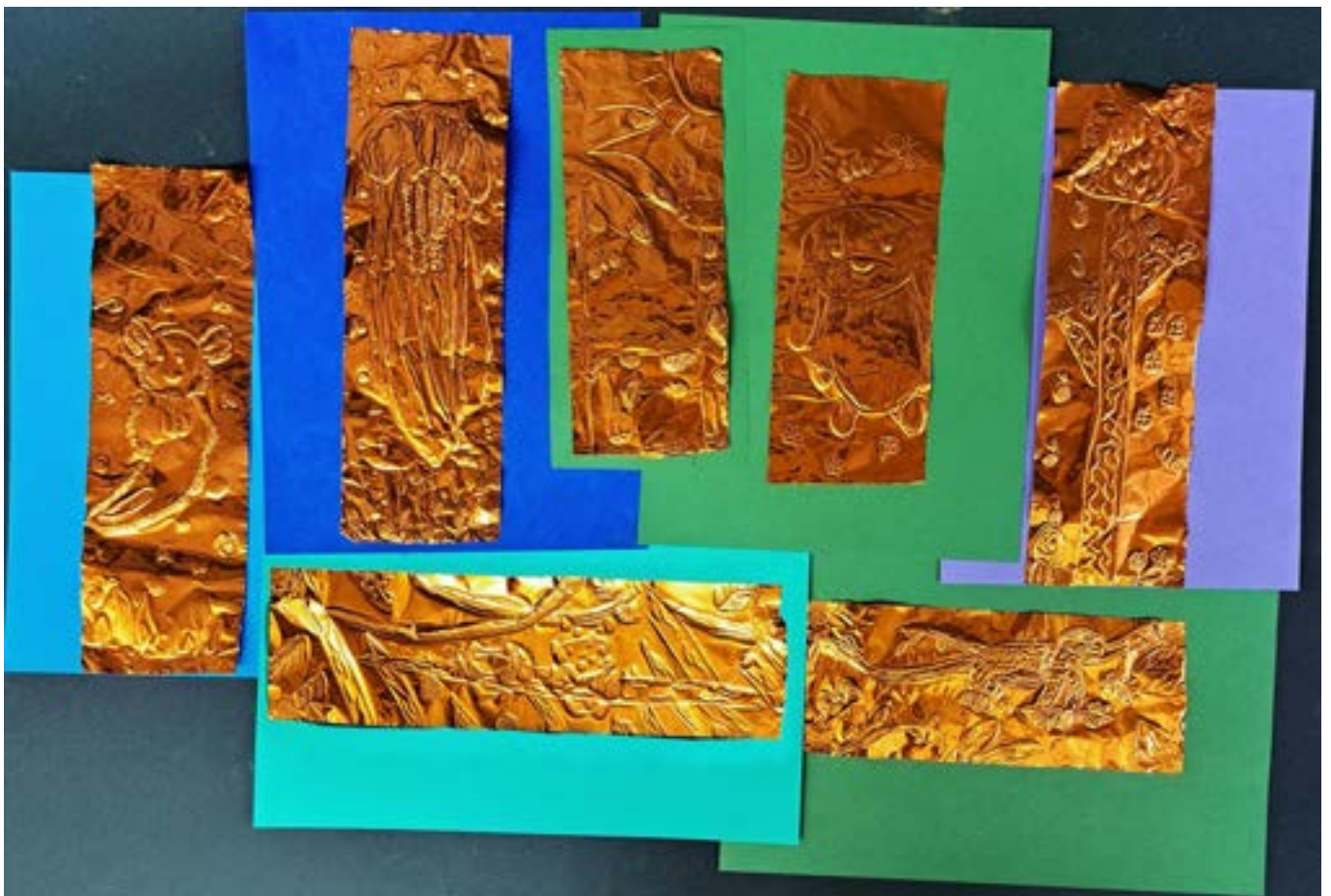


Junior Art Club
