For their theme of Urban and Rural, the main purpose of their visit was to gather first hand resources to work from and inspire their observational studies and investigations.

On the way to the park they walked through urban spaces of Aberdeen and photographed architectural features and structures as well as signs of negative human impact on the city such as rubbish and graffiti.

In contrast, Duthie Park gave them a more rural environment to consider the green spaces, plants and natural forms and photograph these. The girls will now progress their project being encouraged to develop their own ideas around the theme and how they will represent it in their outcomes.
