
























### **3 Junior Cancer Research Charity Collection**

### Theatre Summer School



#### TERMS & CONDITIONS:

- Items of sports gear to include: tennis rackets, hockey sticks, hockey boots and hockey bags - to be in a good clean condition. NO trainers please.
- Standard printable labels are available below. Each item must have a label attached (stuck
  or pinned) with all information / boxes complete failure to do so may prevent processing
  payments, and items will be treated as PTA donations. Un-labelled items are assumed to be
  donations to the PTA. The PTA will not take any responsibility for flimsy, poorly attached or
  illegible labels.
- Suggested asking price 50% of new price please round up to nearest £1.
- 35% of sale proceeds will be donated to the PTA. 65% of sale proceeds will be paid to sellers via bank transfer (BACS) only.\_Individuals who have sold items will be contacted for bank details via email. Payments to sellers will be made following the final sale in the summer term.
- The organisers reserve the right to reject any garments which in their opinion are unsuitable for the sale. Items may be re-priced to reflect a reasonable going rate for that article. Items cannot be returned once submitted.
- All unsold items are retained in school for subsequent sales. After two years they will be sent to a charitable organization.
